Speaker Corey Johnson and the New York City Council:

As New York City faith leaders, we implore you to immediately pass the <u>Fair Chance for Housing Act.</u> <u>Intro 2047-2020</u>, to end housing discrimination against people with convictions.

Housing is a human right. <u>Fifteen to twenty thousand New Yorkers</u> are caught each year in the cycle of homelessness and incarceration. We are committed to setting up New Yorkers to heal and move forward with their lives - but we cannot achieve this goal unless the City acts to end landlord discrimination.

Housing discrimination harms individuals, families, and entire communities. When an individual is denied an apartment, a whole family is denied a home. Housing discrimination based on an individual's conviction records not only perpetuates homelessness, it also undermines the opportunity for mobility and <u>success for families across generations</u>.

Landlords often do background checks under the guise of "safety," but there is no world in which forcing people into homelessness makes our communities safer. Ultimately, an inability to meet economic needs is a key driver of violence. Increasing access to housing makes us all safer.

This is clearly a moral issue, but this is also a racial justice issue. <u>Three-quarters</u> of New York State's formerly imprisoned population are Black or Latinx people. That means that the vast majority of individuals denied housing are people of color. Even though race-based discrimination is illegal, landlords have another way of exiling our communities of color through background checks.

There is a moral imperative to ensure that every New Yorker has a home. Denying a person access to housing because of their past is unconscionable. We ask you to take action now to right this wrong and immediately pass the Fair Chance for Housing Act.
